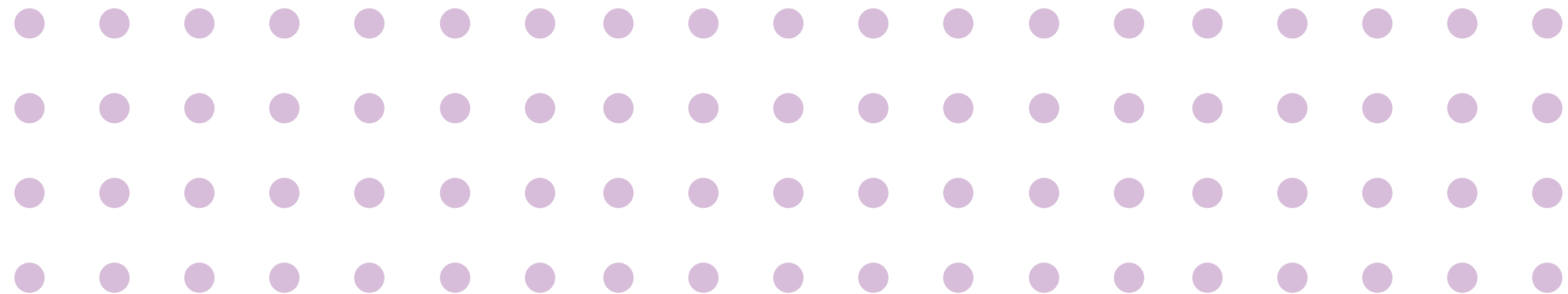
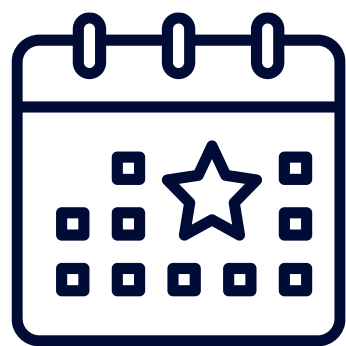

NEW STUDENT DAY

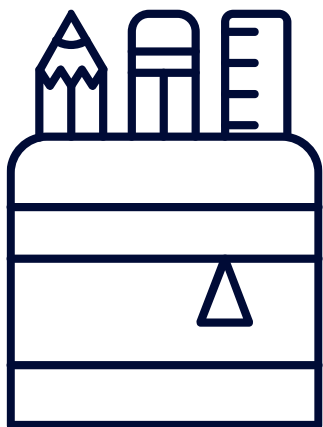
Wednesday 2 July 2025

Opportunity to meet teachers, take part in subject workshops and have their Student ID Photo taken.



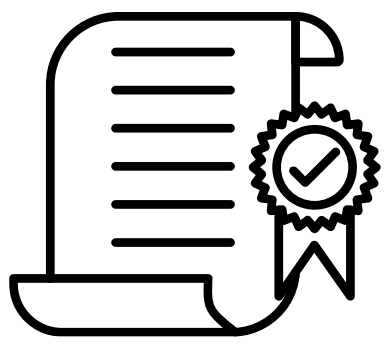
PRE-INDUCTION PROJECTS

Students must attend in person, with a copy of their GCSE results. You must inform the admissions officer if the student cannot make their appointment.

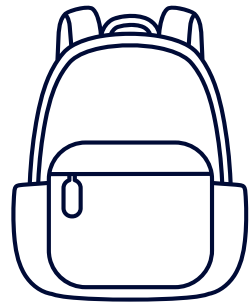

Show respect by behaving considerately and appropriately inside and around our college building.

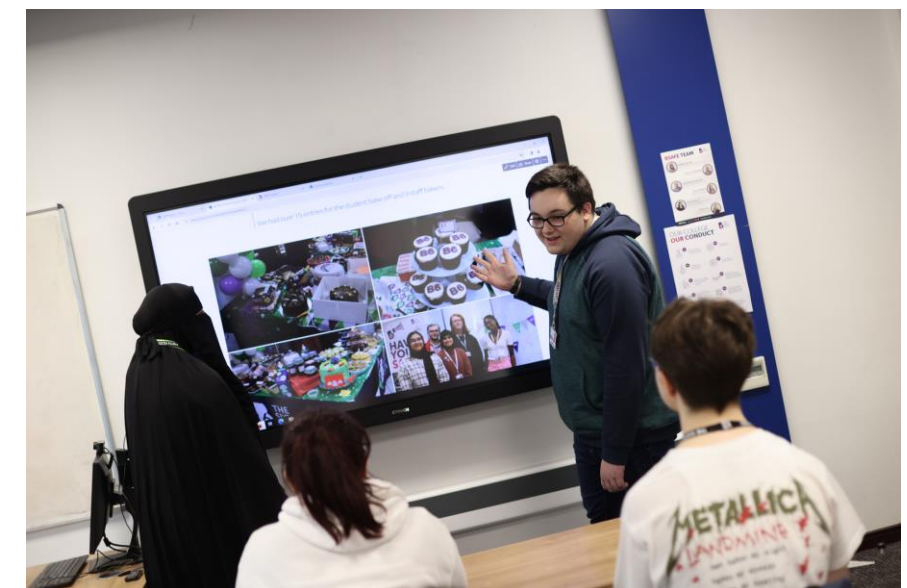
